Well known historian Geoffrey Bishop will give an interesting talk on this iconic winery. His book will also be for sale.



- Committee members Bob Stace, David Monceaux and Anne Both and we welcome new member Liz Silz. Ross Both continues as a co-opted member.


A BIG thankyou to those members who despite the challenges of Covid 19, served for the last 18 months.

BHS buried in a time capsule


